



Rigid Heddle Lace Edged Pillow

Finished pillow size: 16 inches square (excluding ruffle)

Yarn requirements: 1300 yards (1190 meters) fingering weight yarn. Sample used Heritage Hand Paint Bloomfield yarn in Mackinaw colorway.

Notions: Circular knitting needle US size 5 (3.75 mm) 47-inches (120 cm), tapestry needle, matching sewing thread, medium weight woven fusible interfacing (two pieces 17 x 17 inches), large eye sharp sewing needle for attaching ruffle, 16-inch matching zipper, 16-inch pillow form.

Rigid Heddle Requirements: Minimum 20-inch wide loom with 12 dent reed.

Weaving Instructions

Warp length: 54-inches

Warp width: 20-inches wide

Dress loom and weave 42 inches of balanced plain weave (lash on to loom to get most out of warp). Full until 17 inches wide and no less than 34 inches long.

Knitting Instructions

Gauge in pattern: one pattern repeat is approximately 2.25 inches blocked.

Knitting abbreviations: skp = slip one, knit one, pass slipped stitch over stitch just knit

ddc = double decrease: slip one, knit two together, pass slipped

stitch over stitch just knit.

k2tog = knit two stitches together

yo = yarn over

CO 896 sts, join in round and place marker at beginning of round. NOTE: you may find it easier to work 3 or 4 rows flat before joining in the round.

Round 1 and all odd rows: knit

Round 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12: *K1, yo, k3, skp, yo, ddc, yo, k2tog, k3, yo* repeat around.

Round 13: k3 tog around, ending with k2tog (299 sts)

Round 14 : knit

Round 15: purl

Round 16: Knit

Round 17: Purl

Round 18: Knit

BO and block. Inside dimension of each side is 16"

Finishing

Iron fusible interfacing to backside of pillow. Cut two pieces 17 x 17 inches. Width should be 17 inches (selvedge to selvedge). Install zipper following package directions. Sew remaining sides of pillow on machine and turn right side out. Sew ruffle to edge of pillow with 15 points centered on each side and one point eased in by sewing at each corner.

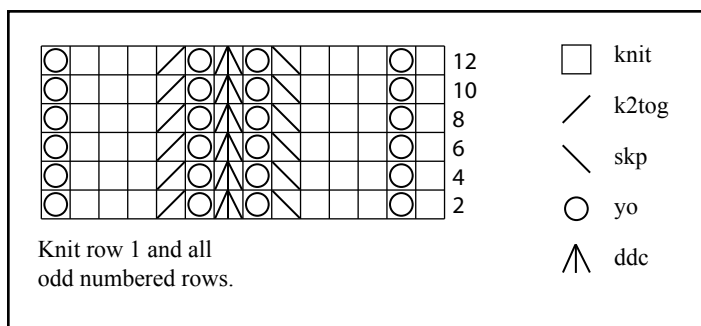


CHART FOR KNITTED RUFFLE
