We buy and broker:

- Knitting needles and yarn
- Crochet hooks
- Weaving yarn and tools
- Spinning fiber and tools
- Spinning wheels and chairs
- Weaving looms and benches
- Coned yarn
- Small looms (inkle, card, etc.)
- Rigid heddle looms and stands
- Related books
- Fiber estates – the whole shebang
- Vintage and antique textiles

What we don't take:

- Antique wheels
- Knitting magazines, looseleaf patterns, and most pattern books

The service we provide:

- Buy outright or accept on consignment (larger looms are negotiated individually)
- Clean and repair, as necessary
- Research value
- Package and price
- Sell

The deal:

- In all cases, we set the prices.
- If bought outright, you can usually leave with cash or check in hand.
- If consignment, you receive 50% of most sales, 70% of large loom and wheel sales. You will receive monthly checks the first of the month, following the first full month of consignment. Goods unsold after six months will be returned to you or donated to Knit Michigan, a tax receipt provided and a final check issued.
